SANTA BARBARA HISTORICAL SOCIETY



The Santa Barbara Historical Society's mission is to promote an appreciation and understanding of Santa Barbara regional history and the importance of history in general. To accomplish this mission, the SBHS collects, preserves, interprets, and exhibits the diverse material culture of the Santa Barbara region; educates children and adults through exhibits, lectures, tours, publications, and classroom activities; and encourages research, scholarship, and publication of historical materials.

The SBHC was founded in 1932 to stem an alarming outflow of artifacts and historical papers from the community's Spanish, Mexican, and American eras. The Society owns and operates four historic buildings, as well as the 26,000-square-foot Santa Barbara Historical Museum. The collections consist of over 78,300 objects. Services are targeted toward homeless and low-income men, women and youth, who are actively seeking employment.
